luniors

The juniors had shown signs of improvement in 2020 and went into 2021 with confidence. The junior team's league campaign featured matches against Aughrim, Tinahely, & Coolkenno. Annacurra completed wins away to Aughrim and home and away to Tinahely with a home loss to Coolkenno the only blot on the copybook in the first 4 games. A draw at home to Aughrim left the league to be decided in the last game away to Coolkenno. A fiery encounter was decided by goals by Fionn & Liam Moules meaning Annacurrawon Division 5 South for the first time in a number of years. This qualified Annacurra for a quarter final of the Division 5 county league which pitted them against old foes Saint Pats. Having been well placed at half time, Annacurra were slow starters in the second half conceding 1-4 in the first ten minutes before rallying and running out of time with a depleted team to lose on a scoreline of 2-9 to 2-12. 2021 marked the first year in which a junior D football championship was contested in Wicklow. 8 teams began the

quest to become the winners of the inaugural competition. Annacurra were pitted in one of two groups with Kilmacanogue, Stratford and Avoca. Annacurra's began at home with a game against Avoca. Annacurra were slow starters in this match but the half time return of Alan Horan to championship action from his 17th retirement saw Annacurra ultimately power to a 4-10 to 0-7 win. Annacurra then travelled to Hollywood to face Stratford. A superb team performance on the night was rewarded with 5-20 to 0-5 with some vintage scores from the evergreen Clive Horan. The final group game was at home to Kilmacanogue and Annacurracompleted a perfect record in the group with a 2-16 to 1-7 win. Annacurra travelled to Shillelagh in the semi final to tackle Coolkenno. With Don Jackman stationed at full forward and his nephew Benny Jackman anchoring midfield a tough assignment was expected. An opportunistic goal from Robert Davey at the end of the first half allowed Annacurra to take control and some superb link play between himself and Clive Horan ensured Clive finished with a personal total of 0-8 as Annacurra advanced to final on a scoreline of 2-10 to 0-

In the final which was played as part of a double header with Avoca's junior B final, Annacurra took a first minute lead with a Clive Horan goal. Avoca struggled to settle to their task in the final with Annacurra's slick attack overpowering Avoca in an excellent first half display seeing them lead on a scoreline of 2-10 to no score. To Avoca's great credit, they put in a much improved second half display to limit the margin of Annacurra's victory to 3-11 to 0-5. This marked a first county title for the men from the Derrywater since 2010 and with the club hoping to compete for higher honours again next year.

The future looks bright for the junior team with great development shown by the younger players over the course of the year allied to the older players showing that there is still some diesel left in the thank.

Off the field there was plenty of activity as well. We replaced the floodlights. This was a big undertaking and the result is that we have new fantastic floodlights.

We also put in two new dugouts. The dressing rooms were painted and new equipment was purchased for the gym. Much of the work was voluntary and we sincerely thank everyone for the time and expense they went to. However there were also significant costs and we thank our very generous sponsors and private donations we received. It takes money to run a club and we thank everyone.

We can't finish up without mentioning deceased members of our club. We said goodbye to some popular and well known figures in the club this year. They are missed and we send our deepest sympathy to their families and to the families of all deceased members of the club. There is no future other than that which is built on the work of the past.
